Exhibits must be entered from 3 p.m. until 7 p.m. on Wednesday at Concordia Community Center and picked up from 4 to 5 p.m. on Saturday.

Exhibit tags should be filled out (see sample) using class numbers listed in the Lafayette County Fairbook. Be sure to include member's birthday on the top half, front side of each exhibit tag. Exhibit tags will be available from club leaders.

All judging of exhibits will be done on the basis of the Danish system which includes blue, red and white groups. The premium money will be divided at the ratio of 3-2-1. Each exhibit in the blue group will merit three times as much money as in the white group and each exhibit in the red group will merit twice as much as each exhibit in the white group.

In no event shall any exhibit receive more than 75 cents per point. Judges decision final.

Responsibility for loss of exhibits: Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, but neither the Fall Festival Committee nor the 4-H projects Committee will be responsible for loss or damage to 4-H exhibits for any cause.
