

FARM PRODUCTS AND HORTICULTURE

Entries in the Farm Products and Horticulture exhibits can be from any county in Missouri and must have been grown by the exhibitor in the last or current year. **Entries must be checked in between 2 and 7 p.m. Wednesday.** Judging will be from 8 to 10 a.m. Thursday. Entries will be open for viewing from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday, and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday. All entries and prizes must be claimed between 4-5 p.m., Saturday.

When there is only one entry in a class, the entry will receive a blue ribbon and first prize money. Only one entry per person per class. Vegetables and fruits will be judged on uniformity, color, condition, size and eye appeal.
