Entry check-in time is 2 to 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, September 4. Exhibit judging 8-10 a.m. Thursday, September 5 (exhibits are closed for viewing at this time); exhibit viewing Thursday, 10 a.m.- 6 p.m.; Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m.- 4 p.m.; exhibit pick-up time Saturday, September 7, 4-5 p.m. When only one entry in a class, the judges reserve the right to award premium accordingly. Only one entry per person per class. Vegetables and fruits will be judged on uniformity, color, condition, size and eye appeal.
